As coronaviruses have displaced many Americans across the country - whether they have left an overloaded city for more spacious surroundings or temporarily moved closer to family - voters face having to cast their ballots for the 2020 presidential election from somewhere else. Fortunately, all states offer an absentee voting option, allowing people to vote wherever they are, even if there are specific policies in each state. While some states automatically send all registered voters a vote-by-post ballot, others require voters to request one in advance and sometimes give a reason to do so. And because of COVID-19, several states have made exceptions to their absent ballot rules to allow residents to do so. However, this has unfortunately put more stress on an already stretched U.S. Postal Service. If voters intend to vote absentee, fill out a ballot application as soon as possible to ensure they get it in time to vote and post it back recommended. Below is a breakdown of politics on how absentee voting is conducted in each state. For more specific information about voting this year, browse to the state you would normally vote in. Alabama absentee voters are required to give a reason to cast their vote out of the state, according to Alabama's secretary of state. Approved reasons for absentee ballots include if the voter expects to be out of the county. To request a ballot, Alabama voters must submit their address, a copy of an image ID and an original signature. Ballot requests must be received no later than the fifth calendar day before an election and are marked no later than the day before an election. The completed vote must be received no later than noon on election day and signed by two witnesses or notaries. This year, voters can also ask for an absentee ballot if they don't want to go to the polls because of COVID-19. Alaska allows anyone to request an mail-in ballot and does not require them to give a reason. To get an absentee ballot, voters can either apply online with a valid Alaska driver's license or state ID and a handwritten signature or apply by post, according to the Alaska Division of Elections. Applications by post must be received 10 days before Election Day. Ballots must be filled in in front of a witness and postal on or before Election Day. Alaska also offers early voting in certain places, Juneau, Anchorage, Wasilla, Fairbanks and Nome. Arizona voters can choose to be added to the permanent early voting list and automatically be sent a ballot-by-mail. Voters can also request a one-time mail-in ballot either online, by calling or emailing the County Recorder, or by submitting an application by mail, according to the Arizona secretary of state. To receive a one-time absentee ballot, voters must request it by October 23, 2020 at 5pm.m. If voters want to be out of town during an election, they can request to have their ballot sent to their temporary address by contacting their County Recorder directly. Ballots must then be received by county election officials by 7 p.m. .m. on Election Day. They can also be dropped off at any ballot drop-box, drop-off location, early voting location, or Election Day voting location on or before Election Day. Arizona also offers early voting starting 27 days before Election Day to 5 .m on Friday before Election Day. Voters in Arkansas can request an absentee ballot by contacting their county clerk or downloading an application online, according to the Arkansas Secretary of State. Voters are able to request an absentee ballot if they will be inevitably absent from your polling station on Election Day, or are a U.S. citizen whose residence is in Arkansas but lives temporarily outside the country's territorial boundaries. Ballots must be requested either by mail or online seven days before an election. They must be received in the secretary's office by 7:30 p.m. .m on Election Day. In Arkansas, a designated carrier can also return a ballot by 7:30 p.m. .m on Election Day. For 2020, voters can also ask for an absentee ballot if they are concerned about their health due to COVID-19. Arkansas also offers early voting starting either seven or 15 days before Election Day. To send a ballot back by mail, they must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the county election office no later than 17 days after Election Day. Voters also have the option to authorize someone to return the ballot on their behalf. For future elections, voters can submit an emailed application to their local county election office, apply in person or by phone. California also offers the option to become a permanent vote-by-post voter, and automatically receive a ballot by mail before each election. Some counties in California also offer early voting in person. Connecticut voters who will be out of town on Election Day can request an absentee ballot, according to the Office of Secretary of the State of the State. After the vote is requested, it will be sent to voters 31 days before a general election or 21 days before a primary. The completed vote must then be received before voting ends on election day. For the 2020 election, all voters in Connecticut are eligible to receive an absentee ballot due to COVID-19. To take advantage of this option, voters are asked to check the COVID-19 on the Declarations must be returned to the Electoral Commission for the voter's county. Returned ballots must be received by the Electoral Commission for the voter's county no later than the closing of the polls at 8 p.m. .m. on Election Day. Applications must be made no later than 17:00 .m the tenth day before an election. The vote must then be sent out by the electoral director within two working days of a request. Returned ballots must be received by the electoral commissioner's office no later than 7 p.m. .m on Election Day. Alternatively, post-in ballots can also be dropped on safe drop boxes at supervisor of election's main or branch offices and early voting seats in the voter's county. Florida also offers early voting that starts at least on the tenth day before an election and ends on the third day before an election. Voters who wish to vote absentee must fill out an absent ballot application online, by mail, by fax, or in person. Applications must be requested by the end of the business day on Friday before Election Day. The county election office must get an absentee ballot by Election Day for voters who are in the United States. For voters who are abroad and cast their ballot on Election Day, the ballot must come within three days. In addition to voting by mail, Georgia allows early voting from the fourth Monday before an election until Friday before Election Day. To take advantage of this option, voters can vote at any early voting place in their county, but are required to bring a photo ID. Ballots must be received by the secretary's office by 7 p.m. on Election Day. Applications must be submitted at least five days before an election if voters live in the United States, or 30 days before an election for someone living outside the country. Returned ballots must be postmarked no later than Election Day and received within 14 days of the election. Alternatively, voters can authorize someone to return their ballot to the electoral authority with a signed declaration on the ballot envelope. To vote early in person, Indiana makes voting available for 28 days before an election until noon the day before the election. To vote by post, voters in Indiana must show a reason, including a specific, reasonable expectation that you will be absent from the county on Election Day, and apply for an absent-by-mail ballot either online, by mail or by email. The application must be received within 23:59.m 12 days before an election. Returned ballots must be received by 18:00. Written applications must be received within 5pm.m 10 days before a general election or 11 days before the second election. To apply, voters must provide their Iowa driver's license or non-operator ID number or their four-digit PIN number for voters. Returned ballots must be received in the county auditor's office by the time the polls close on Election Day. In addition, Iowa voters have the choice to vote in person in the county no earlier than 29 days before an election. Personal voting starts up to 20 days before an election. For 2020, early personal voting concludes at noon .m on November 2, 2017. To vote by mail, Kansas voters can apply for a pre-vote with a driver's license number or a copy of their photo ID by October 27 for the 2020 election. There is no need to provide a reason for the request. Returned ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received at the end of the business on Friday after an election. Kentucky voters can request an mail-in ballot if they are concerned about potentially contracting or spreading COVID-19, according to the Office of the Kentucky Secretary of State. Ballots can be requested through an online portal through October 9 and then through traditional means after that. Returned ballots must be postmarked by Election Day and received by June 6, 2017. In addition, Kentucky voters may choose to vote early in person for some reason between October 13 and Election Day. Louisiana voters can vote by post if they have a valid reason, including if they expect to be temporarily outside Louisiana or their congregation during the early voting period and on Election Day, according to the Louisiana Department of State. Mail-in ballots can be requested through an online system or by submitting the application to the registrar by voters and must be requested by 4:30pm .m. on the fourth day before an election. Ballots must be received by 4:30 p.m. .m on the day before Election Day. They can either be sent back, faxed or delivered to the registrar by voters by a immediate family member with a signed declaration upon delivery confirming that the person is authorized to do so. Alternatively, voters in Louisiana can vote early without a reason personally at the Ward Registrar of Voters Office or at designated places in the ward from 14 to seven days before an election. Returned ballots must be received by the municipal secretary by 20.m. on Election Day. Voters can request a mail-in ballot either online with a Maryland driver's license or VAT-issued ID card, by mail, fax or email, or in person on their local election board. Application requests must be received by June 20, 2018. Returned ballots must be placed on or before Election Day and received by 10.m 13. Alternatively, ballots can be delivered to an early voting center, an Election Day voting center, a ballot dropout box or a polling station when the polls close. Maryland voters can also choose to vote early in person from October 26, 2020 to November 2, 2020. Absent ballots must be requested in writing at least four business days before Election Day. Returned ballots must be received at the conclusion of the polls on Election Day. Voters who want to vote in the post in 2020 don't need reason to do so because of COVID-19. For 2020, ballot applications should be requested by October 28 and returned ballots will be accepted if they are postmarked by elections and now the local election office no later than 6. Absent ballots can be requested online, by mail, by hand, by fax or by e-mail and must be received within 5pm .m on the Friday before an election. Ballots must then be returned to the secretary's office by 8 p.m. .m on Election Day. The ballot can be sent back or delivered by a family member or someone resident in your household. Returned ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the county over the next seven calendar days. Mail-in ballots also have a box for a witness to complete and sign. However, in 2020, there is no need for a witness for registered voters. In addition, Minnesota voters can vote early in person. In 2020, voters can vote early from September 18 to November 2. Mississippi requires voters to provide a reason if they want to vote absentee, including those who temporarily live outside their county of residence or someone 65 years of age or older, according to Mississippi's secretary of state. If voters qualify, they can request that the application be sent to them from the district secretary's office. The ballot application must then be filled in and signed by an official, as a notary public, unless the voter is temporarily or permanently physically disabled. The district secretary's office will then send the ballot back to the applicant. Voters must then fill out the ballot in the presence of a witness and complete the voter's declaration on the back of the envelope. It must also witness it. Returned ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received on or within five working days of the election. Absent ballots can be requested from the local electoral authority in person, by mail, by fax or by email. Alternatively, some relatives, including a spouse, parents or children, may complete an absent ballot application for someone. Ballots must be received no later than 5pm .m the second Wednesday before an election. Returned post-in ballots must be signed and witnessed by a notary and received by the electoral authority at the end of the polls on Election Day. By 2020, voters who have contracted COVID-19 or are in a risk group for the virus, including those 65 or older, may also vote absent. To vote absent, voters must fill out an application and either submit it or submit it at the county election office by noon the day before an election. Returned ballots must be received at the polling station or polling station by 8 p.m. .m. on Election Day. Applications must be printed, signed and sent, faxed or scanned and sent to the county election office by 6 pm.m. the second Friday before an election. Returned ballots must be received at the conclusion of the polls on Election Day. Voters can also vote early in person 30 days before a primary or general election, and 15 days before all other elections, until the day before an election. Absent applications must be received by the local county election representative no than 17 .m on the fourteenth calendar day before an election. Returned ballots must be postmarked by Election Day and received no later than 7 days after an election. In 2020 in particular, all registered voters will be sent a ballot by mail. In addition, voters can vote early in person from October 17 to October 30. Applications for absentee ballots must be returned to the voter's city or city secretary. Returned ballots must receive it by 5.m on Election Day. In 2020, concern over COVID-19 is considered a valid reason to vote absent. New Jersey voters can request an email-in ballot by completing an application and returning it to the county clerk, according to the New Jersey Division of Elections. Applications must be received by the county secretary seven days before an election. Applications can be completed online or by contacting the county clerk's office in person, by phone, by post or email. Applications are due to .m 20 May 2018. Returned ballots must be received by the county clerk's office or brought to an election day polling station no later than 7 p.m. on Election Day. In addition, New Mexico voters can vote early in person from October 17 to October 31. Applications can be booked online, by phone, by fax, in person, by email or by email, and must be received no later than the seventh day before an election. Returned ballots must be postmarked by Election Day, and for 2020, received by November 10. In 2020, New York allows voters to choose to vote absent due to a temporary or permanent illness or disability, including the risk of entering into or spreading COVID-19. Alternatively, New York now allows early voting nine days before Election Day. Voters can fill out a request through the online Absentee Ballot Request Portal or return the form to their county board. Voters can also request one by email, fax or personal. For 2020, the deadline for submitting a request is 5 .m 27. Voters must fill out their ballots in the presence of one witness. Returned ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by 5pm .m 6 p.m. North Carolina voters can also vote early in person from October 15, 2020, to October 31, 2020. To request an e-mail ballot, voters must either electronically fill out an application and print it or request one from election officials in the county, city or school district. Voters must provide a number from their ID to apply. Absent ballots can be requested by submitting the form to the county board. Applications must be received within three days before an election. Returned ballots must be postmarked the day before the election and received no later than 10 days after the election. Ohio voters also have the option to vote early in person starting October 6, 2020. Voters who wish to vote absent can request an application online or download a request form to be sent, delivered in person, faxed or sent to the county election Applications must be received by 5:.m p.m. on the Tuesday before an election. Returned ballots must be notarized or include a copy of the voter's valid ID and must be received by 7 p.m. on Election Day. Alternatively, Oklahoma allows voters to vote early in person on the county election board on Thursday and Friday before all elections, and also on Saturday for state and federal elections. Voters traveling during the election or students going to school out of state can also request an absentee ballot by either filling out a form and submitting it or updating their status online using My Vote. Returned ballots must be received by 8 pm.m. on Election Day. Voters who want to apply for an email-in ballot can make it personal, by mail, or online with a Pennsylvania driver's license or photo ID from the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. Applications must be submitted by 5.m.m on Tuesday before an election. Returned ballots must be received by 8 p.m. .m. on Election Day. Pennsylvania voters can also request to be added to the state's permanent mail-in voter list and automatically receive ballots for all elections for the rest of that year. To request a ballot, voters should download the application from the Rhode Island Secretary of State website, pick up the application in person, or call their local board. Ballots must be received within 4 .m on The 21st of July 2018. Returned ballots must be received by the State Board of Elections by 8 p.m. on the night of an election. For 2020, the state's Foreign Minister Nellie M. Gorbea reminded eligible voters who voted by post a safe and secure option under COVID-19. To get an absentee ballot, voters should request the ballot online or call or email their county voter registration office. Voters should return the application at least two weeks before an election day and must return it by 5pm .m the fourth day before an election. Completed ballots must be signed in front of a witness and received by the county voter registration office by 7 p.m. .m. on Election Day. Alternatively, ballots can be returned personally by someone else by filling out the authorization to return absentee ballot forms. To request an application, voters must download and print the absentee ballot application and then submit it to their county election official. Applications must either be verified or include a copy of the voter's identification card. The application must be received no later than 17.00 .m the day before an election. Returned ballots must be received on Election Day in enough time to deliver the ballot to your voting area before the polls close. To get a ballot, voters must submit a written request to their local county election commission office by the seventh day before Election Day. The application must include the voter's social security number. Returned ballots must be received no later than the closing of the polls on Day. In addition, Tennessee has early voting. In 2020, early voting starts October 14 and runs through October 29. Absent ballots can be requested by mail or online and sent to the early Voting Clerk in the voter's county. Applications must be received by 23 October for the 2020 General Election. Returned ballots must be postmarked by November 3, 2020, and received by 5 .m Nov. Alternatively, Texas voters can vote early in person. In 2020, early voting is from October 13 to October 30. Returned ballots must be postmarked the day before Election Day. Absent ballots can be requested online, in person or by post, and must be submitted within 5pm .m. or at the conclusion of the city's office the day before an election. Returned ballots must be received at the conclusion of the city's office the day before an election or to the polling station before 7 p.m. .m. Absent applications can be filled in online or via paper and sent. Returned ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the registrar by 10:00 AM. Alternatively, virginia voters can vote early in person at their local registrar's office, which starts 45 days before Election Day until Saturday before Election Day. Some counties in Washington may also allow ballots to be forwarded if the voter is on vacation. Returned ballots must be postmarked by Election Day or returned to a ballot with 8 p.m. on Election Day. Returned ballots must be postmarked on or before Election Day and must arrive no later than the tenth day after Election Day. Washington D.C. also offers early voting. For 2020, it's from October 27 to November 2. In addition, the District of Columbia offers a permanent absentee ballot. To request an absentee ballot, voters can fill out the application and send it to the county clerk by fax, mail, email or in person. Applications must be received within the sixth day before each election. Returned ballots must be postmarked by Election Day and received at the start of Canvass (five days after the election, except Sundays). Ballots can also be delivered to the county clerk's office the day before Election Day, although no one can cast more than two voters' absentee ballots. Alternatively, West Virginia also offers early voting. In 2020, early voting starts on 21 May. To get an absentee ballot, applications must be completed and sent to the municipal clerk's office or filled out online. Applications must be received by the secretary no later than 17:00 .m on the Thursday before an election. Returned ballots must be delivered no later than 8 p.m. .m on Election Day. Alternatively, Wisconsin offers early voting in person, but the hours vary by city, village and city. A photo ID is required to vote personally absent. Absent ballots can be requested by phone, by sending the application to the county secretary, by email, in person or online.
